#### **Food Nutrition Service Announcement**

At the end of the 2022-2023 school year, Argyle Central School was informed that our application for the Community Eligibility Program (CEP) meal program through the USDA was approved. Simply put, this program allows all of our student body to receive a free breakfast and lunch daily at school. Parents and students will still have lunch accounts and are allowed to deposit money in them for ala carte items or to purchase additional meals. # Superintendent's Message (Continued)

#### Attendance

The most important goal I have for the upcoming school year is to have our student body attend school on a regular basis and be here on time daily. Studies show that students who are chronically absent, 10 percent of the school year or 18 days, underperform in the classroom. In addition, students who miss 2-4 days of school in September go on to miss a month of school. Conversely, students who have good attendance perform better in school, on state tests and go on to graduate from high school. New York State considers a student chronically absent if they miss 18 or more days of school each year, or two days each month. The state does not discern between excused or unexcused absences. In other words, an absence is an absence, the reason doesn't matter.

I speak for the faculty, staff and administration when I say we are dedicated to working with all families to assist you in getting your student(s) to school on a regular basis. I urge you to contact the school if you are having difficulty in getting your student to school. Our partnership is vital in helping overcome your students' difficulty in getting to school. We have ways to help, but we need to know how best to support you in getting them here.

First Day of Classes and Open House Our first day of classes is Wednesday, September 6, 2023 and the PreK-12 Open House is scheduled for Thursday, September 28th. I look forward to meeting and working with you as we start the 2023-2024 school year.

# Elementary Principal's Message

Dear Parents/Guardians:

Welcome Back! We are excited to begin the 2023-2024 school year. Our teachers and staff have been busy this summer working on our new reading curriculum, revising our intervention services, and getting ready for the 2023 New York State Grade 5 science test. We also hosted our second summer SCOTS camp. Twenty campers joined us on Tuesdays and Wednesdays this summer. We participated in several fun projects that centered around the theme of flight. Check out our Facebook page for the SCOTS Camp slideshow. Our Kindergarten Readiness program was held on August 10 and 11. We enjoyed meeting our new students and helping them prepare for their kindergarten year. We are looking forward to seeing our students back in the classroom and welcoming our new faculty members on September 6. See you soon!



Below is some information you may find helpful:

- ♦ Classroom Schedules: During the first few days of school, teachers will be sharing their classroom schedule with you. We have set aside 60-90 minutes for each of the core subjects (Math, ELA, and Science/Social Studies). These times may vary according to the grade level. This year there are two sections of Grades K-4 and we are implementing a middle school model in grades 5 and 6. We will continue to provide a full day 5 hour program for our Pre-Kindergarten students.
- Specials: We will continue the 5-day special rotation schedule. Your child will have art, music, library, and at least two PE classes each week. We are excited to add a maker space opportunity for our second and fourth graders and possibly some dance education. More information will be sent home in September.
- Intervention Blocks: Each 5 and 6 grade classroom teacher will provide intervention to their students. Intervention is typically a 30-minute block of time each day where teachers deliver extra help or enrichment in the various subject areas. At the K-4 level, reading intervention will be delivered by our RTI/AIS staff. We have added some extra support at the primary level this year with the addition to focused WIN (What I Need) time for grades K-4.
- Grades 3-6 New York State Testing: This year we administered the New York State ELA and Math Assessments. Our teachers and support staff will be sharing the results of these tests with you in September and providing any necessary academic support.
- New Faces: We are excited to welcome our new Superintendent, Mr. James Bennefield, and our new Junior/Senior High Principal, Mr. John Galarneau. We have been collaborating this summer on setting our district goals. I look forward to the great things we can accomplish for our ACS students.
- Open House: Our annual Open House will be held on Thursday, September 28, 2023. We look forward to opening up our school this year and having our families visit our classrooms.
- Parent Teacher Conferences: Mark your calendars for November 13, 2023 and December 1, 2023. Our classroom teachers will be sending home information very soon.
- ♦ Attendance Matters: This is a goal we are working on this year. It's important to have our students here at school every-day. Research shows that missing 10 percent of schools days can negatively affect a student's academic performance. That's just two days a month. We will be working with our families this year to ensure good attendance and support our students in any way we can.

Please know my door is always open. You can contact me anytime and I will do my best to answer any questions or concerns you may have.

Thank you again for your continued support. I look forward to seeing you at our family events.

### **Pesticide State Requirements**

Dear Parent, Guardian, and School Staff:

New York State Education Law Section 409-H, effective July 1, 2001, requires all public and nonpublic elementary and secondary schools to provide written notification to all persons in parental relation, faculty, and staff regarding the potential use of pesticides periodically throughout the school year.

The Argyle Central School District is required to maintain a list of persons in parental relation, faculty, and staff who wish to receive 48-hour prior written notification of certain pesticide applications. The following pesticide applications are not subject to prior notification requirements:

- A school remains unoccupied for a continuous 72-hours following an application;
- Anti-microbial products;
- Nonvolatile rodenticides in tamper resistant bait stations in areas inaccessible to children;
- Nonvolatile insecticidal baits in tamper resistant bait stations in areas inaccessible to children;
- Silica gels and other nonvolatile ready-to-use pastes, foams, or gels in areas inaccessible to children:
- Boric acid and disodium octborate tetrahydrate;
- The application of EPA designated biopesticides;
- The application of EPA designated exempt materials under 40CRF152.25;
- The use of aerosol products with a directed spray in containers of 18 fluid ounces or less when used to protect individuals from an imminent threat from stinging and biting insects including venomous spiders, bees, wasps, and hornets.

In the event of an emergency application necessary to protect against an imminent threat to human health, a good faith effort will be made to supply written notification to those on the 48 -hour prior notification list.

# Sbestos

In accordance with the Asbestos Hazard Emergency Response Act (AHERA) of 1987 (40 CFR Part 763) all school employees, parents/guardians, and all building occupants are hereby notified that the Argyle Central School Asbestos Management Plan is available to the public for review Monday through Friday 8:30 am to 2:30 pm.

Under the AHERA Regulation, the school district is required to reinspect all facilities which contain asbestos materials once every three (3) years. Moreover, periodic surveillances are conducted by our Building and Grounds personnel on a regular basis.

Keep an eye out for new items as well as our favorites! Please know that communication is very important to me and please contact me if I can answer any questions.

♦ Who are we? Our fabulous Food Service Team consists of myself and six amazing people: Chelsea Bates, Joy Hennessey, Missy Irwin, April LaPoint, Stacie Rozelle, and Kathy Scott.



#### FREE MEALS!

GREAT NEWS!!!!! Breakfast and lunch are FREE for all ACS students in 2023-24. Argyle Central School is also encouraging families to complete an income form found HERE. The form is vital for other grants and aid programs that will benefit our school. Thanks to the Community Eligibility Provision program that we have qualified for!

- Breakfast is such an important part of the day! All students have the option of getting breakfast each morning—whether they are dropped off or coming off the bus. Grades K-6 GRAB 'n GO bags are available outside the Multipurpose room each morning! We will have two choices each day (consisting of 2 grains, 1 fruit, or juice and milk). Grades 7-12 will get their breakfast in the cafeteria.
- Lunch options will be awesome as usual.
- Meal Accounts—We will NOT accept cash during meal service. Families can send in checks or cash for elementary children through the classroom teachers. High school students should try to bring any checks and cash to the cafeteria first thing in the morning. The BEST OPTION is to pre-pay on MySchoolBucks at any time. MySchoolBucks is an excellent option to keep track of balances and purchases—www.myschoolbucks.com to manage your child's account.
- ♦ Notes on Account—Our system allows parents/guardians to be able to have a note on their child's account. Please send any notes/communication to the Food Service Director to add onto accounts. This includes allergies—please be sure the nurse and food service have updated doctor notes.

#### **♦** Free and Reduced Applications

- ⇒ Federally funded Community Eligibility Provision Household Income Eligibility applications will be sent home with each child at the start of each school year. It is not "required" in order to obtain FREE BREAKFAST AND LUNCH, as ALL students will be able to eat school breakfasts and lunches at NO CHARGE, our District and students will benefit from free and reduced meal eligibility information. It only takes a couple of minutes to fill in the blanks on the application. Thank you!
- ⇒ Most Importantly—Our program runs independently from the General Fund and reimbursements are how we can pay our bills! Reimbursements are based on Free/Reduced application numbers.... Please fill them out.
- Classroom Celebrations—We will continue our classroom celebrations this year! I will have the forms available on the website and I can email them or send them home with students any time.
