- NYS 3-8 Testing: In the spring our students in grades 3-8 will be taking
  the New York State ELA and Math Assessments. During the month of
  January, our students will participate in a computer based simulation of
  those tests. More information to come.
- Reminder ...Looking for lost items: Our Lost & Found bin is overflowing! Please take a few minutes to look through items when you come into school and claim anything that belongs to your student.
- Recess reminder: We try our best to take the students outside for recess.

Our Big Brothers Big Sisters School (BBBS) Based Mentoring Program has entered its 19th year at Argyle!



### Body Mass Index (BMI) Survey for Grades K, 2, 4, 6, 8, 10 & 12

Dear Parents/Guardians:

As part of a required school health examination, a student is weighed, and his/her height is measured. These numbers are used to figure out the student's body mass index or "BMI." The BMI helps the doctor or nurse know if the student's weight is in a healthy range or is too high or too low. Recent changes to New York State Education Law require that BMI and weight status group be included as part of the student's school heath examination. A sample of school districts will be selected to take part in a survey by the New York State Department of Health. If our school is selected to be part of the survey, we will be reporting to New York State Department of Health information about our students' weight status groups. Only summary information is sent. No names and no information about individual students are sent. However, you may choose to have your child's information excluded from this survey report.

The information sent to the New York State Department of Health will help health officials develop programs that make it easier for children to be healthier.

If you **DO NOT** wish to have your child's weight status group information included as part of the Health Department's survey this year, please print and sign your name below and return this form to me by January 22, 2024.

### **Pesticide State Requirements**

Dear Parent, Guardian, and School Staff:

New York State Education Law Section 409-H, effective July 1, 2001, requires all public and nonpublic elementary and secondary schools to provide written notification to all persons in parental relation, faculty, and staff regarding the potential use of pesticides periodically throughout the school year.

The Argyle Central School District is required to maintain a list of persons in parental relation, faculty, and staff who wish to receive 48-hour prior written notification of certain pesticide applications. The following pesticide applications are not subject to prior notification requirements:

- A school remains unoccupied for a continuous 72-hours following an application;
- Anti-microbial products;
- Nonvolatile rodenticides in tamper resistant bait stations in areas inaccessible to children;
- Nonvolatile insecticidal baits in tamper resistant bait stations in areas inaccessible to children;
- Silica gels and other nonvolatile ready-to-use pastes, foams, or gels in areas inaccessible to children;
- Boric acid and disodium octborate tetrahydrate;
- The application of EPA designated biopesticides;
- The application of EPA designated exempt materials under 40CRF152.25;
- The use of aerosol products with a directed spray in containers of 18 fluid ounces
  or less when used to protect individuals from an imminent threat from stinging
  and biting insects including venomous spiders, bees, wasps, and hornets.

In the event of an emergency application necessary to protect against an imminent threat to human health, a good faith effort will be made to supply written notification to those on the 48-hour prior notification list.

### **Asbestos**

In accordance with the Asbestos Hazard Emergency Response Act (AHERA) of 1987 (40 CFR Part 763) all school employees, parents/guardians, and all building occupants are hereby notified that the Argyle Central School Asbestos Management Plan is available to the public for review Monday through Friday 8:30 am to 2:30 pm.

Under the AHERA Regulation, the school district is required to reinspect all facilities which contain asbestos materials once every three (3) years. Moreover, periodic surveillances are conducted by our Building and Grounds personnel on a regular basis.
