

The 2024-25 New York State Tuition Assistance Program application opened on November 1 for students to apply.

- The application is available at <u>ny.gov/TAP</u>
- Now that the 2024-25 FAFSA is open, students should submit the FAFSA before the TAP application.
- Students will need to <u>create a HESCPIN</u> using their email address and a unique password in order to access the TAP application. Students who have an NYS Driver's License, non-driver ID, or Student ID will be asked to include that information when creating their HESCPIN account.
- Students who saved their TAP application before the FAFSA was released must now submit their FAFSA by February 15, 2024. Failure to do so will result in the saved TAP application being deleted. Students will then need to submit a new TAP application.

If a student listed at least one New York State school on their 2024-25 FAFSA, they can use the link at the end of the FAFSA to return to and submit their TAP application for processing. If you have any questions about TAP, contact tapprocessing@hesc.ny.gov

The 2024-25 FAFSA is now open!

FSA has now opened the 2024-25 FAFSA full-time. The application is available 24/7 except for normal routine site maintenance. Students do not need to rush to fill out the form immediately. FSA has said it will not transmit results to schools until later in January, so students have additional time to prepare and file their FAFSA. Here is what students, families, and schools need to know:

- Although the FAFSA is now open full-time, there are still known issues FSA is working to resolve. You can find those issues on the <u>FSA Issue Alerts page</u>.
- Anyone required to report information on the FAFSA is now called a "contributor." Each contributor will need their own unique StudentAid.gov account (FSA ID).
- All contributors will be required to consent to the Direct Data Exchange (DDX). This allows the IRS to share financial information directly with the Department of Education and colleges listed on the FAFSA.
- FSA will not release student data to institutions until the end of January 2024. No exact date has yet been given for the data release.
- After all sections of the online FAFSA form are completed and submitted, the student will receive a confirmation email noting their submission date, their estimated

Student Aid Index (SAI), and estimated Federal Pell Grant eligibility. However, the student will not receive a FAFSA Submission Summary until the FSA processes the FAFSA, beginning in late January.

StudentAid.gov accounts for Individuals without a SSN:

The 2024-25 FAFSA will require all contributors – regardless of their citizenship status – to have a StudentAid.gov account to access and sign the FAFSA form. See the full <u>December 22, 2023 announcement</u> for more details and a complete step-by-step guide to the account creation process.
